
<u>5Rs:</u>

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<u>School</u>

Amethyst class: In Amethyst class this week, we have started our new transport topic - "on the move." We have read the story "Naughty Bus" by Jan Oke, searched for red "tricky" words on clipboards, played a bean bag game in maths, worked in the car garage role play area and enjoyed cosmic yoga.

Sapphire class: In Sapphire class this week we have been learning all about 2D and 3D shapes. In English we have started to explore a new book called "The Lion Inside"; we have discussed and made predictions about what happens in the story. In science we have been identifying animals that are birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles and mammals.

Pearl class: This week the children have been practising adding and subtracting ones. We have used Base 10, number lines and 100 squares to help us. We have been writing about the morning and night sky, using adjectives, co-ordination (but, so) and commas to separate a list. In Science we have investigated where our food comes from. We looked at packaging to find the information and calculated how many food miles each item had travelled. We discussed the advantages and disadvantages of imported food. In Reading we have been looking at The North Pole in our book 'Above and Below.'

Amber class: Amber Class have had a very busy few days starting the New Year. As well as the panto on Friday, children have been starting their Maths, English and Reading sessions with their new class books The Iron Man and Stone Age Boy. We have also worked really hard on our new rainforest layers display in the classroom - more info in this week's news story.

Emerald class: This week year four have worked on learning their 11 and 12 times tables in maths. They have used bar models to represent times table facts and used mathematical vocabulary such as product and factors. In English, they wrote letters to Leon to persuade him to either enter or not enter the magical box. The class finished their art project on Victorian houses and completed a 'my happy mind' lesson about celebrating our character strengths. Year four enjoyed their PE session this week and of course loved attending the Pantomime in Crewe on Friday.

Ruby class: This week in Ruby Class, the children have begun to work on calculating equivalent fractions. In English, the children have been writing and editing descriptive pieces about one of the worlds on Yggdrasil - the World Tree according to the Norse people - and imagining that they have visited the land of the fire giants, the realm of the Norse gods, or even the halls of the dead...

We have started our new class book, Odd & The Frost Giants and have been predicting and inferring information using evidence from the text and cover. In History, we have discussed why the Romans left Britain and why the Anglo-Saxons came. The children have written "party" invites from King Vortigern to the Saxons, Hengist and Horsa to help him fight off the Picts.

Diamond class: In Year 6, the children have been learning about religious and non-religious views of suffering in the world, and what questions Christians might have about God and the suffering experienced by people. In Science, the class have been learning about the refraction of light and have been using lenses to change the direction and speed of the light rays.
