

School

Amethyst Class This week in Amethyst Class we have read the story 'The Rhyming Rabbit' by Julia Donaldson and continued our work on rhyming words. We have also learnt about The Easter Story. In maths, we have been consolidating our knowledge of numbers to ten by finding groups to count from pictures in our favourite stories. We have explored ways to make 9 in a beanbag game and introduced estimation. We have also continued our Read Write Inc phonics lessons and enjoyed making Easter crafts.

Sapphire Class The children have worked really hard this week. In English they have ordered events from our story. In maths they have compared measurements of classroom objects and worked out the difference using subtraction. In R.E the children have been learning about the meaning of Palm Sunday.

Pearl Class This week, Pearl class have been looking at the techniques used by the artist, Gustav Klimt, and creating their own Trees of Life based on his. They have also been testing out their mechanisms outside in the school grounds. Looking back at all the texts the class has studied, the children have chosen their favourites and written book reviews.

Amber Class In Amber Class this week we have been working on book reviews and looking at what is important information to include. We have continued our revision on Fractions and we have been looking into the Easter Story during our RE sessions. As part of this, we put ourselves in the position of Peter and created artwork depicting different aspects of the Easter Story.

Emerald Class This week in Emerald class the children have worked on equivalent fractions, fractions greater than one and how to count in fractions! They know what improper fractions and mixed numbers are. In English, they wrote a setting description of the Pompeii volcano explosion and edited their writing. For History they looked at the twelve Gods from Ancient Greek times and in R.E. they studied the events in the Easter story and wrote speech sandwiches to describe what happened during the resurrection. The children also worked really hard during guided reading where they look at the layout features of an information text and worked on being able to summarise key points.

Ruby Class In Maths this week, Ruby Class have continued to develop their understanding of converting improper fractions to mixed numbers. In English, we have begun our new Pathways book 'The Lost Happy Endings'. We have looked at expanded noun phrases, prepositional phrases and have used these to help us write 100-word stories about 'Jub'. In History, the children joined in with Mr Blenkiron's song all about the Ancient Greek Olympic Games, and took part in our very own "Audlem-pic" games on the school field. In RE, we have been looking at symbols of Easter and why they represent Easter for many Christians around the world. We have also been looking at the Resurrection and identifying whether an argument is in support of it happening the way it happened in the Bible, or against it.



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Diamond Class In Year 6, we have been busy finishing the writing of our wonderful Jemmy Button stories. The children have really surpassed themselves in writing some very effective stories which capture the reader's interest. They have also been writing book reviews so that they can recommend them to others and have been perfecting their brilliant Easter poems and designs. In maths, they have been revising fractions and learning how to compare and order.
