




We have completed our work on Time in maths and in Reading, we have used the Illustrated Atlas of Great Britain & Ireland to write fact files about different countries in the UK. We then used this experience to help us in our Geography and History studies where we moved on to writing fact files about modern-day and ancient Egypt. Friday was very fun when we were able to bring in our own toys from home.

Emerald Class

This week Emerald class have worked on telling the time using an analogue clock. Then they learned to convert it into the 24hr clock. In English, the class edited their descriptions of items needed for a rainforest trip. The children finished their final pieces in art and reflected on their painting skills and their composition choices. We investigated days of the week and greetings in French and Spanish. In science, the children made a mini rainstorm to investigate how precipitation occurs.

We have been converting units in Maths and in Art we discovered tree frogs and their vivid colours.

Wednesday saw their final church service where they read some lovely memories of their time at Audlem St. James; some were very touching, while others reminisced about times when chicks had escaped or teachers had fallen over!
