RULES AND REGULATIONS COVERING THE SHOW

1. All exhibits must be arranged in the hall and staged the on show tables, excluding Classes 73, 77 & 78 in Floral Art and excluding the Children's section.
2. Exhibits can be staged from 6pm – 8pm on Friday 20 August 2021.
3. Exhibits can be staged from 8.00am on Saturday 21 August 2021 and must be completed and the hall cleared by 11.45am **PROMPT.**
4. Exhibitors must apply to the Secretary for Class Cards to be placed with exhibit and must be responsible for displaying exhibits according to Schedule. Only the Show Stewards may, if necessary, move exhibits.
5. The Judges will be empowered to withhold any prize if, in their opinion, the exhibits do not possess sufficient merit.
6. The Judge's decision will be final.
7. No exhibit or prize card to be removed from the Show Table before 3.15pm.
8. The committee reserves the right to withhold or vary the prize money in any Class in the event of insufficient entries.
9. All produce must be 'Home Grown' by the exhibitor.
10. Any objections must be lodged with the Secretary by 2.30pm together with a deposit of 50p which will be forfeited if the objection is not sustained.
11. Prize money paid on the day of the Show following presentation of prizes.
12. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may arise from any cause whatsoever.
13. Exhibitors to provide vases, dishes and plates etc. Society paid up Members must apply for vases if required and return them at the end of the Show.
14. Entry Fees – £2.50 up to 5 entries, 10p per entry thereafter.
15. Any Exhibitor not complying with the above Rules and Regulations is liable to forfeit any prize money due.
16. 'Novice' is a competitor who has not won more than three First Prizes in any 'Section' Class.
17. In the event of exhibitors gaining the same number of points, the number of 1st prizes will be taken into consideration.
18. In the event of there being no entries for which a trophy is awarded, it may be moved to another class at the Committee's discretion.
19. Closing date for entries is **STRICTLY Tuesday 17 August 2021.**

AWARDS AND TROPHIES

The Presidents Cup – Awarded to the best exhibit in show

The Timpson Silver Salver – Annual award for service to the society.

The Royal Horticultural Society Banksian Medal –

will be awarded to the person with the highest number of place points in the whole of the **horticultural classes** at the Show.

The competition for the medal is open, i.e. it is not confined to the members of the affiliated society, though, if some classes are confined to members, as is usually the case, members will naturally have the best chance of winning the Medal. This rule only applies to those societies which include open classes in Show schedules.

Exhibitors who won the Banksian Medal(s) in 2019 or 2020 are not eligible to win this Medal. Exhibitors sharing in the cultivation of, and exhibiting from the same garden or allotment, will be considered as a single exhibitor and if one is awarded the Medal, neither of them is eligible for the next two years.

(Entries in Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10 do not apply for this award).

Special Class 1 – Top Vase

Trophy: The Doris M Robinson Memorial Challenge Cup

Prizes 1st £5, 2nd £3, 3rd £2.

Top vase, a vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10, taken from a minimum of 2 different kinds of plants. Please note that it is 2 different kinds of plants, 2 varieties of the same plants are NOT 2 kinds.

The display is judged out of a total of 35 points, split into 25 for the colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display, and 10 points for the overall presentation and effect of the flowers in the vase which will be viewed from all directions. Stems should be flowers only, berries or seed heads not allowed.

Special Class 2 – Top Tray

Trophy: The Stapeley Water Gardens Nigel Davies Memorial Cup

Prizes: 1st £5, 2nd £3, 3rd £2.

Top tray, a collection of 3 types of vegetables taken from the following list of fifteen. The quantity of each vegetable required for the collection is given in brackets: carrots (3), cauliflower (2), onions (3), parsnips (3), peas (6 pods), potatoes (3), runner beans (6 pods), tomatoes (6), French beans (6 pods), sweetcorn (2), pepper (3), cucumber (2), courgettes (3), red beet (3), aubergines (2).

Each vegetable will be judged out of 20 points, 7 for size, shape and colour, 7 for condition, 6 for uniformity. The overall mark will be out of 60.

All vegetables to be staged for effect within an area measuring 45cm by 60cm (18in x 24in) without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray.
