<u>School</u>

Amethyst class In Amethyst Class this week, we read 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' by John Burningham and 'Who Sank the Boat?' by Pamela Allen. We made invitations, wrote speech bubbles for the characters and designed a new boat. In maths, we compared the weight and length of objects. We also practised counting beyond 20. To celebrate Children's Mental Health Week, we played fun circle time games together to promote this year's theme 'Lets Connect.'

Sapphire class This week in Sapphire class we have started to read "The Curious Case of the Missing Mammoth". We have used adjectives to describe the characters. In science we have been learning about the four seasons and what happens during each season. In maths, we have been exploring subtraction.

Pearl class This week in Pearl Class we have been adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers as well as looking at 2D and 3D shapes. In English we have been learning how to write different types of sentences-statement, question, exclamation and command. In Science this week we have been learning about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We have worked as a team to sort animals using a Venn Diagram. In RE we have looked at The Story of Moses and we have all made a basket for baby Moses to keep him safe.

Amber class This week, Amber Class have been looking at the different types of life found in the different layers of the rainforest. In science, we looked at how different bones in the human skeleton have different roles and how some support the body and others provide protection to internal organs. In maths we have











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looked at different strategies to answer division questions and our reading sessions have looked at the title of our class book The Iron Man and got us thinking if other titles may have been more appropriate. In our writing sessions this week, we have analysed Stone Age Boy and looked at how it fits our story mountain planning template and we have started working on our own story in a historical setting. We have also enjoyed another swimming session, playing our recorders and learning more about the Islamic faith.

Emerald class This week year 4 have been practising various methods for multiplying 3-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers. They have used fronted adverbials to write a setting description of the view from Tranio's balcony and also written a diary entry about Tranio's daily activities. The class have had a brilliant singfest rehearsal in Nantwich and also enjoyed their swimming lessons this week. The children strengthened and repaired their Roman shields and started to learn about the importance of looking after your teeth in Science.

Ruby class This week in Ruby Class, the children have been focusing on multiplying by two-digit numbers using the formal method of multiplication. In English, we have been looking at writing dialogue that advances the plot rather than writing conversations which distract from the events of the story.

On Safer Internet Day, the class enjoyed a lesson from the BBC on how to react to certain online situations, and designed their own game character with powers to help against online threats such as spam, scams and cyberbullying. In RE, the class discussed Muslim role models from the sporting world and considered how they have shown commitment to their faith through their actions. The children are looking forward to performing their historical class assembly on Friday, which will take the audience from the end of the Roman occupation of Britain, right through the Anglo-Saxon and Viking period, and ending with the Norman conquest - hopefully, with a few laughs thrown in along the way.

Diamond class Year 6 have been learning all about how the internet works, in Computing. They have been looking up IP addresses to understand how computers 'speak' to one another. In maths, they have learning about ratio, and, in English, they have been writing poems based on The Selfish Giant by Oscar Wilde. They have also been reading another Oscar Wilde story: The Devoted Friend, and this has sparked some intense discussion about what make a good friend!
