School

Amethyst Class This week in Amethyst Class, we have read the story Supertato by Sue Hendra. We have made comic strips, drawn our own superheroes and written sentences about Supertato. In maths, we have used Rekenreks for the first time and been practising our subitising skills. We have also enjoyed singing nursery rhymes on Well-being Wednesday and playing parachute games together.

Sapphire Class The children have all worked super hard this week. We are extremely proud of them. They have all given 100% to every task they have been given. In maths they have been learning about half of shapes and working out half of quantities. In English the children have been learning about verbs and how to change them using suffixes. In R.E the children have begun learning about weddings. In science they have been using their detective skills to search for materials that are magnetic and non-magnetic.

Pearl Class In Pearl Class this week we thoroughly enjoyed writing an account of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We wrote about lots of the events, including the Trooping of the Colour, the Thanksgiving Service, the Party at the Palace Concert, the meeting between the Queen and Paddington Bear, the Pageant and how we celebrated ourselves! In Mathematics we have started learning about time, including telling the time on an analogue clock to the hour, half



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past, quarter past, quarter to and 5-minute intervals. In our Mastering Number programme we have investigated subtraction bridging through 10. In Science we began planning to investigate different conditions plants will grow in.

Amber Class Amber class have come back to the start of our last summer term and really have hit the ground running! We have taken part in maths sessions that have been testing our recall of number facts and the speed with which we can calculate mentally. In English, we have started to look at our new class book (Zeraffa Giraffa) and have been considering our predications about the book and looking at how plausible they are. Our new class reading book has seen us adopt an adventurous mindset as we look at the Illustrated Atlas of the UK & Ireland and our PE session focussed on athletics to get us ready for Sports Day. We also enjoyed completing some artwork for our history display! A very busy week!

Emerald Class This week, Emerald class worked with tenths and hundredths in maths. They used them on a place value chart and practised partitioning decimals. In English, the children created a list of rules for direct speech and wrote a speech sandwich to show a conversation between of the villagers in 'When the Giant Stirred.' The class finished their journey of a river sketches in geography and labelled world maps with famous rivers. We did a PSHE lesson where the children talked about when you might need to ask permission from someone to do something. The class has also been having a go at a practice multiplication test in preparation for the national multiplication check which they will complete next week.

Ruby Class This week, the children have been looking at the key features of a script and have familiarised themselves with this format by reading and acting out sections from Shakespeare's Macbeth and an adaptation of the nursery rhyme, Jack & Jill. In guided reading, we have been looking at technical vocabulary on the subject of global warming and have been answering comprehension and literary retrieval questions based on articles and graphs about greenhouse gases. The children have also been brilliant during their maths and English assessments this week, tackling them with focus and resilience. In athletics, they have been put through their paces in preparation for Town Sports in a few weeks. On Wednesday afternoon, the class enjoyed their marble reward (which they achieved on the last day of last half-term). They wore their own clothes, watched Encanto, had biscuits, played out on the field and finished the day with a classic game of Heads down, Thumbs up.

Diamond Class Year 6 have been concentrating on Science this week. They have been writing non-chronological reports about their own hybrid animals, and have also been learning about the circulatory and digestive system. They have also started to rehearse for their leavers' show at the end of term. Lots of singing!
