School

Amethyst Class This week in Amethyst Class we have read the story 'Supertato.' We have written instructions of how to rescue the peas from the blocks of ice and written speech bubbles for the characters. In maths, we have been doubling numbers to ten using numicon, dice and dominoes. We have also enjoyed starting our new Superhero topic, making masks, designing capes and building dens.

Sapphire Class A busy first week back in Sapphire class. The children have been wowing Mrs Kemp and Mrs Hayward with their knowledge of multiplication facts. In design and technology, the children have been writing instructions in preparation for the construction of their bicycles next week. In English they have been discussing the feelings of the characters in our story Toys in Space.

Pearl Class This week, Pearl class have started their new guided reading book Fantastic Mr Fox by Roald Dahl. We have enjoyed reading the first two chapters, analysing the characters and making predictions about the story. In Writing we have collected information and facts on endangered animals and we are now experts! In Science we have continued to make observations of our growing sunflowers and we have set up our 'bean in a bag' investigation on germination. In PE, Pearl class have been practising for Sports Day-we're ready!

Amber Class Welcome back to Amber Class! We have started the half term with 2 new books to help us with our reading and our writing - Zeraffa Giraffa & The Illustrated Atlas of Britain & Ireland. We have continued our PE sessions focussing on Athletics ahead of Sports Day and we have enjoyed a philosophical discussion about inclusion and compassion.

Emerald Class This week in Emerald class we have revisited to column multiplication and started to look at using different methods to work out simple divisions. The class have used part whole models to partition dividends into easier number to divide. The class have been working hard on times tables to prepare for the multiplication check. In English we have finished our class book and made sure we can punctuate direct speech perfectly. We have planned our writeaway task to retell the story using the first person. The children worked on using 'call and response' in Music and investigated different types of mountain formation in Geography.

Ruby Class This week in maths, Year 5 have begun to look at decimals to two decimal places, and using this knowledge to help them place decimal numbers on a number-line and to estimate measurements.

In English, we have been extending our knowledge of vocabulary that will be appearing in 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' using our dictionary and online research skills - including looking up the etymology of words (Did you know 'fruit' comes from a Latin word meaning 'to enjoy'?).

We have also been looking at the four countries of the UK in relation to each other on a compass; working out ways to remember where the capital cities are; learning the names of the rivers that run through them; and manipulating maps to represent pictures to help us recognise a country by its shape (Have you ever noticed that Great Britain looks a bit like a witch riding a pig?) In PE, we have been working on how to triple-jump, making sure our hops are actually hops, and enjoyed a game of rounders on Thursday afternoon. We have also started a sweepstake for the Euro Cup. Each child (and Mr B) have a country to support that was chosen at random – come on, Poland!

Diamond Class This week in Year 6, the children have been enjoying their level 2 Bikeability training. Every child enjoyed a whole day's cycling around the local area and passed with flying colours. Back in class, we have been focusing on our maths, and have learned about ratio and solving problems with two unknowns. Tricky stuff, but the children have given it their best. Next week, we hope to begin a new topic in science and start writing our stories.



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Sunny weather - sun-hats, sun-cream and water bottles please

The weather continues to be hot and sunny so can I remind you that the children need water bottles, sun-hats and sun cream. On hot days sun cream can be used by children before they arrive in school and then only a top-up will be necessary at lunch-time.
