All the children have enjoyed the different work that they have been learning throughout the week and the classrooms have been buzzing with activity. Here is an overview of what has been happening in every class.

Amethyst class: This week in Amethyst Class, we read 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. We wrote invitations for a space party and wrote a list of all the food we would take for a picnic on the Moon. In maths, we investigated the shapes made by Numberblock Four and made similar arrangements. We saw that Numberblock Four can be arranged with 2 blocks on top of another 2 blocks or as a line of 3 with 1 on top, and











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connect both to 4. We also used 2d shapes to make space pictures and used solid 3d shapes to build space rockets.

Sapphire class: This week in Sapphire Class we have been continuing our learning on counting and representing numbers on Tens Frames in Maths. In English we have been writing lists of what Peter would take to the South Pole and writing sentences about how he was feeling throughout the story. The children have also enjoyed learning about North, East, South and West, some new PE games, looking at historical pictures of Audlem and learning new songs in Music. Sapphire class also enjoyed their walk to the church and singing their Harvest songs.

Pearl class: This week the children in Pearl Class performed 'Cauliflowers Fluffy' beautifully in the Harvest Festival at church on Tuesday. In Science we have been looking at seasonal changes and what we might see during different times of the year. We created beautiful finger paintings of trees in the four seasons. In Maths we have continued looking at number lines and we have compared objects and numbers using 'greater than', 'less than' and 'equal to'. In English we have written a letter in role as Tabitha's mum/dad asking her to come home. We focussed on using expanded noun phrases to describe and specify, subordination (because) and coordination (and). We are enjoying reading our class read 'Trolls Go Home' by Alan MacDonald. In P.E. we played a game which required the children to work together as a team using defenders to protect their tags and attackers to take tags from their opponents. In History, we learned about Samuel Pepys who is a significant figure in History.

Amber class: This week in Amber class, we have learned how to count in 50, how to compare numbers and how to order numbers. In English, the children have explored using paragraphs and the reasons for a new paragraph. The class studied Mary Anning in Science, made their cave animal painting on their textured background in art, continued work on their electrical posters in DT and had a fitness session in PE. The class loved performing in church and enjoyed their recorder session with Mrs Shackleton.

Emerald class: This week, Emerald Class wrote and performed their lovely autumn poems in church. They were very evocative of the sights, sounds and smells of autumn and have put us in the mood for bonfire night and roast dinners! The class have also been busy learning about Victorian inventions and have been constructing their own torches as part of their Design & Technology learning. We can't wait to test them out!

Ruby class: On Tuesday, the children demonstrated their outstanding singing during the Harvest Festival at St James Church. This week in Ruby class, we started looking at estimating addition and subtraction questions to help us confirm whether we have the correct answer. During English, we have written an extract from a newspaper report introducing 'The Fearless Miss Taylor' as she arrives at Niagara train station. The children have continued their 'doodler' project in DT, finishing their design, we should be starting this next week. The class have also been working hard on their PE, Art and French skills.

Diamond class: This week we have been focusing on learning rules of divisibility to check whether a number is a multiple of 2, 4, 3, 5, 6, 9, 10, 12 or 15. We have also revisited Prime and Composite numbers. In English, we have been looking at the passive voice and how it can change the meaning or effect of a sentence. In History, we have learned about some of the innovative designs of WW2 tanks and how they changed to become less vulnerable and more cost effective. In Science, we have investigated how shadows can change depending on the position of the light source, and in D&T, we have begun to sew the seams on our waistcoats.
