Amethyst Class This week in Amethyst Class, we finished reading the book Silly Doggy by Adam Stower, sequenced the pictures and retold the story. We also read That Pesky Rat by Lauren Child and matched animals to their correct homes. In maths, we looked at a 'whole' number being made up of smaller number parts and investigated different ways to make 5 and 10. We visualised and used spatial language to describe the groups within 5 and 10 and recalled these number bonds automatically. We also enjoyed our PE lesson practising the relay race on the school field.

Sapphire Class The children have had a very exciting week. They carried out a range of interesting activities during Forest school with Mr Hadfield on Monday, and even made clay hedgehogs. In English the children have been writing sentences in the style of the characters from the story Lost in Space. In maths the children have been leaning about arrays and have also drawn them on the playground. In science the children have been continuing their investigations about materials.

Pearl Class In Pearl Class this week we really enjoyed learning about important historical events during Queen Elizabeth's reign of the 1960's, including the first landing on the moon, England winning the World Cup and popular food, fashion and music. We then created press-prints of different pictures for these events and themes. In Mathematics this week we have developed our knowledge of shape. We learn about counting vertices of different shapes, lines of symmetry and right-angles. We investigated which shapes are symmetrical and which shapes are not and how many lines of symmetry different symmetrical shapes have. We also investigated how many shapes we could make with a two-piece tan gram. In Science this week we have learnt about different parts of a flowering plant and how they are useful for the plant. In Religious Education we learnt about the story of Hanukkah and why the miracle in the story is celebrated by Jewish people.

Amber Class Amber Class have had a very creative week this week! As well as continuing to make, draw, design & produce fantastic pieces of work about the Ancient Egyptians at home, in school we have been expanding our knowledge of sketching by using viewfinders and enlarging images. In maths we have looked at the relationship between different fractions both in terms of ordering and comparing and in English we have been developing the depth of the descriptions we can write about a setting. We have discussed the things we are thankful for and have been enjoying the sounds of different periods of modern music - this week, the 80s!

Emerald Class This week, Emerald class have been finishing off their fractions topic in maths by learning to calculate fractions of quantities. In English, they have finished their recounts of the eruption of Mount Vesuvius and edited them. They have started to look at our new class book 'When the Giant Stirred.' In History, we examined historical evidence of the story of The Trojan Horse and in RE the children investigated how different religious believers pray. In Art the class finished off their watercolour tessellations for The Queen's Jubilee and in Music the class worked on clapping three beat bars.

Ruby Class In Ruby Class this week, the children have been learning how to multiply fractions by whole numbers and then convert any answers, which come out as improper fractions, into mixed numbers. Later on in the week, the class will be applying their knowledge of fractions to amounts.

In English, we have been learning to spot the difference between formal and informal language. We have started writing our letter about the Poison Pool in The Paperbag Prince in Writing Conference, focusing on formal language and persuasive techniques.

In RE, we have compared what we know about Christianity to what we have learned so far about Hinduism and the children have decided which Hindu god sounds the most interesting to them.

In RSE, we have discussed the evolutionary benefits of racial diversity (why people from different countries can have different features) as well as gender stereotypes (assessing which, if any, have their basis in truth and which are totally arbitrary).

In PE, we have continued our rounders tournament and have focused on being strategic when it comes to which posts to run to and which posts to stump.

Diamond Class Year 6 have been shining bright, this week. They have come in early every day with a positive attitude and have tried their very hardest at their SATs tests. They have enjoyed the breakfast club each morning with



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cinnamon bagels, toast, juice and milk and have even asked for it to continue! They certainly deserve a restful weekend before we get writing next week. Well done, Year 6.
