#### School

Amethyst Class This week in Amethyst Class, we read the book Shark in the Park by Nick Sharratt. We made our own rhyming books, wrote a list of all the places we spotted the shark and played I spy. In maths, we made staircase patterns using the Cuisenaire rods and practised our number formation. We also enjoyed our transition time in the Year 1 classroom on Tuesday.

Sapphire Class This week in Sapphire class we have been measuring centimetres using rulers and recognising coins and money. In RE we have been practising for our wedding next week. Everyone enjoyed watching the Y6 class performing their Leavers' Assembly to the school. In English this week we retold the story of Little Red Riding Hood and used traditional tale features of writing to make the story exciting. In Mathematics, we have ordered two-digit numbers to 100 and explored recognising coins. In Topic we explored the book 'Rosie's Walk' to understand mapping a route with landmarks and then we drew a map of the route we take from home to school. In Science we investigated how materials change through heating and cooling by melting some chocolate!

**Pearl Class** This week, Pearl Class have been taking part in the Visyon 'Moving On' Project to support transition from KS1 into KS2. They looked back on their favourite parts of Year 2, thought about the things they are looking forward to in Year 3 and next, they will share any worries they have. In English, they have used the opening verse of 'Teddy Bear's Picnic' focussing on the line 'If you go down to the woods today...' They have used adjectives to write a description of the woods and what can be seen and heard e.g. red toadstools, windy branches, spooky shadows and prickly bracken. They then picked out the adjectives used and changed them by adding the suffixes -er and -est. They discussed the effect this has on their descriptions e.g. the reddest toadstools, the spookiest shadows. In Maths, they explored volume using problems that could be solved using four operations. In Art, they created images of the Fantastic Mr Fox using watercolours.

Amber Class Amber have been busy developing their acting skills this week! After reading about how 'Giraffe-mania' gripped France in the 1800s, pupils have been busy creating sketches where street-sellers were trying to sell their products to the masses.....with various levels of success experienced and profits made! In maths we have been looking at measurement and we have also looked at the inner-workings of a PC. We have taken a PC apart and children have looked at the various components and even re-seated RAM modules, handled the CPU and wired in power & data cables!

**Emerald Class** This week, Emerald class have been rounding money to the nearest pound. We did some role plays to practise this skill which the children really enjoyed. The children have finished writing their 5-part narratives in

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English and are really proud of their stories! Work has begun in DT on construction of 3D volcano models. The class have built their structures and papier-mached the mountain form. The class learned about estuaries and the wildlife they support in Geography. We had a fantastic Geography/Art trip to Carding Mill Valley to study the rivers, hike and make some sketches of the landscape.

Ruby Class This week, in Ruby Class we have been continuing our work on measuring angles, this time using protractors for accuracy. We have also completed some maths work in our Geography books using the data we collected on our river study. On Tuesday, we enjoyed watching Year 6's Leavers' Assembly rehearsal - and the children were treated to a choice of football or rounders during PE to avoid the heat of the hall.

On Wednesday, Ruby Class accompanied Emerald Class to Carding Mill Valley in the Shropshire Hills. We had a beautiful day for it and the children really enjoyed their hike, their picturesque lunch and our river study - where we got into the river to measure it at different points as well as its speed.

On Thursday, we will be having our talent show and I am really looking forward to being able to hear some of the pieces the children have put their effort in to learning (as well as what the non-musicians have come up with)!

Diamond Class Year 6 have been real stars this week. They have been working hard to refine their sketches, learn their lines, make props, learn dance moves and then perform their Leavers' Assembly to the school and then to parents. We had a few tears (not from the children!), but the children have loved working together to produce their own show. Their prayers and poems were delightful. We are very proud of them. Well done, Year 6! Our shining stars! Attendance this week

In EYFS/KS1, Amethyst class have the best attendance and in KS2, Amber and Emerald have the best attendance. Congratulations to all three classes.

#### Hot Weather expected over the weekend and early next week
