As a school we are concentrating on the 5 'R's - resilience, reflectiveness, responsibility, resourcefulness and readiness to learn. These are the children who have shown such qualities this week:

School

Amethyst: This week in Amethyst Class, we continued reading 'The Pirates are Coming' by John Condon. We went on a treasure hunt, labelled a pirate ship and made 'Wanted' posters. In maths, we sequenced and ordered numbers. We used words 'more than' 'fewer than' and 'equal to.' We played '6 or not 6?' with arrangements of objects and played 'Fast fingers' by holding up our fingers in different combinations to represent the numbers 1-8. We also had fun during Science Week, looking at floating and sinking and investigating slime.

Sapphire: The children have had a really busy week. They have been learning about the Easter story in R.E. In English the children have made posters for a missing pet and written 'Thank you' letters to our friend at Fordhall Farm following our fun trip on Wednesday. In science as part of British Science week the children have been learning about different jobs that involve science, and we watched an online story session with a real scientist. In maths the children have been extending their knowledge of tens and ones.

Pearl: In Pearl Class the children have developed their mastery of the present progressive tense where describing scenes from the story Major Glad and Major Dizzy. They explored statistics in Maths; interpreting data using tally charts, pictograms and block graphs. The children have evaluated the effectiveness of the moving vehicle that they designed and made. To celebrate British Science Week, we enjoyed watching a live STEM story-time as well as researching minibeasts using the NFU Education live lesson. In Music this week we are learning about music around the world and this week we stopped in France - we learnt to sing Frere Jacques in rounds. In support of Comic Relief, we enjoyed our Red Nose race, the cake sale and performing comic acts.

Amber: In Amber class this week we have been looking at the book "The Big Blue Whale" in English. We have written a letter to David Attenborough to ask questions about a whale using similes. In maths we have been measuring in mm, cm and metres and solving problems with these. In science we learnt about different skeleton types - endoskeleton, exoskeleton and hydrastatic skeleton.

Emerald: This week Emerald class have practised punctuating direct speech. They have written dialogue between Tranio and Livia as Mount Vesuvius began to erupt in Pompeii. In maths, we have started to work on fractions and introduced the idea of equivalent fractions. We have also been practising the seven times table this week in preparation for the year 4 multiplication check in the Summer. In History, the children studied Roman architecture and leisure activities such as visiting the bathhouse. The class worked on computing and getting their lego we do resources ready to start coding next week. The class looked at teeth in Science and learnt about incisors, canines, pre-molars and molars. We have also been polishing our singfest songs as our performance is in less than 2 weeks!

Ruby: For British Science Week, Ruby class have been looking at coral reefs and life cycles. They have been practising long multiplication in maths and in English they have been continuing their work on "The Darkest Dark". In art, the children have been looking at Banksy and the implications of his public artworks. They've been looking forward to Comic Relief today and their guided reading has been based on it.

Diamond: Year 6 have been enjoying British Science Week by learning lots about different types of living things. They have learned about different vertebrates and have been answering questions such as 'what makes a dolphin a mammal'? To learn about the classification system, they have been sorting out sweets into groups. They have also had great fun organising their Red Nose Day talent show and selling red noses around the school.

Prayers to Share this week - We pray for everyone at home, school, local community and the wider world at these uncertain times to be safe and well.
