As a school we are concentrating on the 5 'R's – **resilience**, **reflectiveness**, **responsibility**, **resourcefulness and readiness to learn**. These are the children who have shown such qualities this week:

<u>School</u>

Amethyst class: This week in Amethyst Class, we continued to read 'The Three Little Pigs,' by Mara Alperin. We added sound buttons to words, described the wolf and made 'Watch Out Wolf' posters. In maths, we compared the number of objects in 2 sets by matching them 1:1. We reinforced the language of 'more than', 'fewer than' and 'an equal number' to describe how many objects there were in each set. We also enjoyed our PE session on Monday with North West Coaching and played relay races, hurdles and team games.

Sapphire class: This week in Sapphire class we have been especially busy with our learning. In English, we have started planning and writing our own stories based on the book 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. In maths we have been continuing our work on addition and number facts. In science we are learning about classification and have played the scientific sorting game '4 legs or not?'. In history we are starting to learn about some of the oldest and newest building in Audlem. We have also been very excited to practise our Christmas songs.











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Pearl class: This week in Pearl the children have used adverbs to describe a journey Plop the owl took down from a tree. We have also looked at fireworks using our senses and described what we might hear, feel, see, smell and taste. We have been looking closely at placing numbers on a number line and estimating where numbers would go. We have been practising our songs for the Christmas performance and in RE we have retold the Christmas story using story mapping. The children met an Archivist from The Cheshire Records Office on Tuesday. They learned about how Primary Sources and records (diaries, photographs, marriage certificates and Parish Registers) can help us to understand the past. It is anti-bullying week and the children in Pearl Class decided that we should all 'Reach out with kindness' to prevent bullying and to make sure all the children in school feel valued. They created a piece of artwork to share their ideas.

Amber class:

Amber Class have had another busy week this week! Jam-packed full of maths (where we looked at the rules of column addition) and English (where we discussed dialogue and how to write it correctly) as well as Science, RE, Music, Art, PE and lessons where we focussed on our Anti-bullying theme this week.

Emerald class:

This week Emerald Class have practised column subtraction with multiple exchanges and looked at efficient ways of solving subtraction calculations. In English, they have written first person, description accounts of Leon's first encounter with the circus tent and planned and written a story about a mysterious shop appearing in school. In Science, the class built simple circuits with buzzers, light-bulbs and fans. In RE the children explored The Holy Spirit and made dove mobiles as symbols of The Holy Spirit. They also learned the story of the Pentecost. We had a fantastic Singfest rehearsal and the children looked at primary and secondary sources in History.

Ruby class: This week in Ruby Class, the children have been looking at multiples and factors, and enjoyed a multiple-writing competition to the Countdown theme-tune. In English, we have been looking at dialogue and have begun to write stories retelling the tale of Jub and the Lost Happy Endings. In History, the children interviewed a "real life" war horse called Duncan about his experiences and then engaged in a debate about whether animals should be used in wars. For anti-bullying week, the children watched the BBC Live Teach lesson, completed various activities during the show and finished by creating acrostic advice posters on the theme of 'Reach Out'. In Science, the class have learned about levers and fulcrums, and how to make a load easier to lift. The children have also had the pleasure of extra sessions on homophones and telling the time with Miss Raiswell.

Diamond class:

In Year 6 this week, the children have been learning about how to spot cyberbullying and what to do if they experience it. They have also been learning about the laws around online communication, and now know that these laws can protect them if they experience cyberbullying. The class have also been writing a newspaper report about their class book which is set in World War 2 in occupied France. They are also very excited to learn their Christmas songs for next week's Big Switch On!
