## <u>School</u>

**Amethyst Class** This week in Amethyst Class we have read the story "What the Ladybird Heard" by Julia Donaldson. We have drawn maps of the farm, labelled the locations and used the pictures to describe the animals. In maths, we have been consolidating our knowledge of numbers to ten, matching numerals and objects playing a snap game, filling tens frames and recording our scores in tally charts. We have also continued our Read Write Inc phonics lessons and enjoyed completing activities for science week.



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**Sapphire Class** This week in Sapphire Class the children have been investigating length. In ICT the children have been using navigational skills to guide a robot around a maze. In English the children have been writing extended sentences.

**Pearl Class** The children in Pearl Class have started a new book this week called Major Glad and Major Dizzy by Jan Oke. They have learned to write consistently in the past and present tense. They have described and drawn their favourite toys. In Maths, they have explored the two times tables and have solved problems related to multiplication. Our school is taking part in the Census 2021 education programme, 'Let's Count!' which is being run by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) in the lead up to the census which takes place on Sunday 21st March. The children in Pearl Class have counted their favourite fruits. In Science, They have explored animals in their habits.

**Amber Class** Amber Class have completed a number of assessments this week, including reading, maths and grammar & punctuation. We have continued with developing our Hockey skills in PE and have been busy decorating our classroom by making a huge collage showing the different layers of the rainforest and finishing our artwork inspired by the post-impressionist artist Seurat. Finally, on Friday as part of our 'Let's Count!' work combining this with Comic Relief, we held an Amber Class Stand Up comedy show where we counted how many jokes the children of Amber Class could memorise and deliver to their friends. Does anyone know why pirates are called pirates....?

**Emerald Class** This week, Emerald class have begun to work with equivalent fractions in Maths. They have looked at fraction walls and how you must always do the same to the denominator as you do to the numerator. In English, they planned their writing conference task which was to write a past tense, first person diary entry including conjunctions and fronted adverbials. They wrote their diaries during the week too. The children finished their artwork on Greek pots, learned about Palm Sunday in RE and built and coded a model lego frog robot in computing. We participated in the Let's Count day on Friday and enjoyed celebrating Red Nose Day.

**Ruby Class** This week in maths, we have continued to look at equivalent fractions, and thinking about the golden rule of whatever you do to the numerator also must be done to the denominator.

In English, we put what we learned about the key features of a diary entry into practice and have written diary entries from the perspective of Hades.

In science, we have looked at the life-cycle of a bird and made circular revealers to showcase what we have learned. In History, we have been looking at important events from Ancient Greek times, and creating our own timelines of the facts we found the most interesting using ICT.

For Red Nose Day, we will be completing a classroom census about what makes both unique and the same and relating this to our work on fractions. We will also be having a comedy talent show within the class; hearing jokes, watching funny dances and performing comedy sketches - Mr Blenkiron and Miss Moore will be presiding as judges!

**Diamond Class** This week in Year 6, we have been learning about the importance of the census and have been thinking of things we can count on our Let's Count! day. So far, the children are thinking of how many jokes they can learn ready for Red Nose Day or counting some sports-related challenges. Watch this space! In English, they have been learning how to write for effect. They have been very carefully choosing their words and crafting their sentences into some wonderful narratives, using some short animations for their stimulus. Some of them haven't wanted to stop! We have been progressing well with our art and hope to have some wonderful 'Growth' self-portraits ready for display very soon.
