As Friday 21 June will be taken up completely with our Sports Day (Early Years and Key Stage 1 in the morning and KS2 in the afternoon) we have postponed the Praise Assembly until next Friday, 28 June when parents will be invited. #### <u>School</u>

**Amethyst Class** This week in Amethyst Class, we finished the story 'Supertato.' We wrote rainbow sentences in different colours, wrote a letter and made comic strips. In maths, we explored and represented patterns within numbers up to 20. We also looked more at evens and odds and recalled double facts. We also enjoyed Sports Day on Friday.

**Sapphire Class** This week in Sapphire Class we have had another busy week! The children have been working so hard and should be very proud of their efforts. In English we have been continuing to write our stories about Oscar's next adventure with a new creature from the museum. I have been very impressed with the children's story telling skills, phonics knowledge and their beautiful handwriting. They have written some excellent stories and have enjoyed sharing them with one another. In Maths we have been focusing on equal and unequal groups, doubling, grouping and sharing numbers equally. In the afternoons, they have enjoyed practising for Sports Day, singing songs and playing some percussion instruments, making their own cars, completing a science experiment on how stretchy a material is, learning about how planes were invented and creating their own display poster on the United Kingdom.











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**Pearl Class** This week the children have been working hard on their assessments. In Maths we have been learning about mass as well as position and direction. In PSHE we have been exploring the difference between 'needs' and 'wants' and how we make decisions about how we spend money. We made a Diamond 9 to put our ideas in order of importance. We enjoyed competing in Sports Day and we hope you loved watching us too!

**Amber Class** This week year 3 have been learning to tell the time to 5 minutes and 1 minute on an analogue clock. They have researched dangers to whales and planned articles about whales in English. The class have improved their tennis skills and worked on their Egyptian collars in DT. The class have learnt about places of worship in RE and have looked at the forces of pushing and pulling in Science. The children enjoyed a spectacular Ancient Egyptians workshop on Tuesday and a wonderful Sports Day on Friday.

**Emerald Class** In Emerald Class this week, the children have been writing all about daily life in Ancient Greece. They have found out that, despite all the things to admire about this ancient civilisation, conditions were not very good for women. In fact, women were only allowed out to visit neighbours or attend festivals and funerals! The children have compared education for children in ancient Greece for boys and girls, and will be seeing whether these conditions were the same in Sparta as in Athens. The class have also been practising for Sports Day and have found that the skipping race is a dangerous activity!

**Ruby Class** The emphasise has been on sport this week with Town Sports and our sports' day today. It was very pleasing to see how well the children represented the school. In English, the class has based their creative writing on a photograph of a stone wizard near a potting shed! In maths, we have concentrated on adding and subtracting decimals.

**Diamond Class** We have had a week full of sporting events with Town Sports on Monday and Wednesday, and then Sports' Day today. We have also been enjoying ourselves preparing for our end of term production "The Wrong Way Round". We are proud that four members of Y6 represented our school so well yesterday at "The Big Ambition" (see earlier in the newsletter for full details).

### Attendance this week

Whole school weekly attendance this week is 95.71% which is slightly below our aim of 97%. In EYFS/KS1, Amethyst class has had almost full attendance this week and In KS2, Emerald class has had the highest attendance. Congratulations to both classes.
