

Praise Book and 5Rs children this week

Because we have two classes away for the Friday assembly, Praise Book and 5Rs children will be receiving their awards a week on Tuesday when we are all back in school and their names will be mentioned in the newsletter on Friday 4 November.

<u>School</u>

AUES' SCHO

All the children have enjoyed the different work that they have been learning throughout the week and the classrooms have been buzzing with activity. Here is an overview of what has been happening in every class.

Amethyst class: This week in Amethyst Class, we read 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. We wrote invitations for a space party, wrote a list of all the food we would take for a picnic on the Moon and wrote a description of an alien. In maths, we investigated the shapes made by Numberblock Four and made similar arrangements. We also used 2d shapes to make space pictures and used solid 3d shapes to build space rockets. We also enjoyed learning about the different planets.

Sapphire class: In English we have started work around a new book "Lost and Found". We have made predictions about the book by looking at different items and we have written what we can hear and see at the seaside. In maths we have used number lines and have started a new unit working with parts and wholes. In

Pearl class: Thank you to the Fire Fighters of Audlem Fire Service for a wonderful visit. The children learned about the role of a fire fighter and the protective clothes the fire fighters wear. The children learned about the parts of the fire engine and they thoroughly enjoyed using the fire hoses to squirt water. In class, we drew detailed pictures of the fire engine and labelled the parts. We compared modern fire-fighting equipment to equipment available in 1666 to fight the Great Fire of London. In Forest School we talked about the fire triangle identifying that fire needs fuel, heat and oxygen to burn. In Maths, we added positioned tens and ones on a number line and we wrote Thank you letters in English.

Amber class: In our studies this week, we have finished our time with The Sea Book in Guided Reading and Seal Surfer as the inspiration for writing. We have written a letter from the future grand-son of our main protagonist and in Maths we have completed our current module of Place Value, ready to move on to Addition & Subtraction after the half term. We enjoyed our final forest school's session on Monday and have been using the Lego We.Do.2 kits and iPads to develop our coding skills. We created a machine to recreate the impact earthquakes have on buildings to investigate how robust different structures and foundations are.

Emerald class: This week Emerald class have used noun phrases, prepositions and fronted adverbials to plan and write their own animal adventure story inspired by 'Gorilla.' In Maths, the class finished their topic on place value and began to work on addition of four-digit numbers. We have practised our singfest songs in music lessons and researched inspirational people in RE. The class completed a DT/Science project where they investigated which materials may be best for blocking out sound. In groups, the children made ear defenders out of a variety of materials. They also tried to make sure that their design was stylish and comfortable. The children have finished their first section of the 'My Happy Mind' programme and have practised happy breathing!

Ruby and Diamond classes: Y5 and Y6 have been having an excellent time on their three-day residential visit to Stratford-on-Avon. The Sea Life Centre on the way down was brilliant as the children became "habitat explorers". Yesterday they visited Mary Arden's farm and took part in a workshop on Shakespeare's Macbeth "Will in the World". In the evenings they have enjoyed a cinema night and a disco! Today they are visiting a butterfly farm on the way home. We look forward to hearing about their adventures when they arrive back in school this afternoon.
