Amethyst This week in Amethyst class, we read 'You be You' by Linda Kranz. This follows on from a story called 'Only One You' that we have read by the same author when the children started last September. In maths, we played dice games and had fun with the Numberblocks. We compared size, weight and capacity. We also enjoyed painting with water colours and going to the church to see our Year 6 Buddies leavers service.

Sapphire Class We have been working hard on our writing and have been writing our own retelling of the story 'Toys in Space'. We have completed our Place Value unit and have been learning about Money and Time in our Maths sessions. We have also enjoyed making our own group sculptures using newspaper. We also had a History poster competition about Mae Jemison. The children showed their creativity and excellent team building skills. They also enjoyed playing cricket in PE and are getting very good at their bowling, batting and fielding skills.

Pearl Class In Design and Technology, Pearl class have learned about a balanced, healthy diet, designing healthy meals including foods from different food groups. They have designed a wrap to promote healthy school dinners. They developed cutting, spreading, grating and snipping skills and they made their wrap and tasted it.

Amber Class This week, year 3 have been working on mass is maths and using grams and kilograms. They have also looked at 3D shapes. The children have written blessings for Zeraffa on her journey to Paris and put them into sacred amulets. The class enjoyed practicing their invasion and defence strategies in PE and enjoyed making frottage collages in their art lesson. The children learned about light sources in Science and watched the Year 6 Leavers' performance.

Emerald Class Emerald Class have rounded off the year with some brilliant writing about anglerfish. They have used their best writing and decorated the report with wonderful illustrations. All the children are really proud of them, as am I. They have also been learning all about decimal numbers and have been learning about the different Greek Gods and Goddesses. There has also been lots of singing as we prepare for the final church service of the year - the children are very happy as they are their favourites.

Ruby Class This week in Year 5 has been full of exciting learning! In English, we continued writing our stories inspired by "The Hunter," and everyone's creativity is really shining through. In Maths, we started exploring shapes and learned about understanding and using degrees to measure angles. It's been fun discovering how angles fit into different shapes. In Design and Technology, we kept working on building our bridges, making them even stronger and more impressive. Great job, everyone!

Diamond Class This week, Diamond Class have been perfecting their end of year performance of "The Wrong Way Round" as well as writing prayers, poems and memoirs about their time at primary school for Friday's Leavers' Service at church. On Wednesday, the Year 6s completed sessions on puberty and human reproduction, showing great maturity and interest with their questions.
