School

Amethyst class: In Amethyst Class this week, we read 'Stick Man' by Julia Donaldson. We sequenced the story, listed ways to use a stick and wrote Christmas lists. In maths, we investigated ways to compose and de-compose the number 3 using cubes and paint stamps. We explored how 1 and 2 are parts of 3 and began to use spatial language to describe some 2d shapes. We also read 'Stanleys Stick' by John Hegley and had fun thinking up names for our own sticks that we had collected.

Sapphire class: We have had a busy week in maths learning number bonds to ten. In English the children have been learning how to write factual sentences about penguins. In I.C.T the children have been learning how to log on and search for images of climbing frames. In phonics the children have been impressing us with their 'sticky knowledge' of the digraph 'oy'. They have also been busy designing and making a variety of Christmas decorations.

Pearl class: This week in Year 2 we have been very busy rehearsing for the Christmas Play and the children have been wonderfully learning the songs, dances and lines. In English, we planned and independently wrote our own story with a beginning, middle and ending, all about a troll and a child who are complete opposites. In Maths we explored the rules of fact families for addition and subtraction. We also practised subsidising and representing the number 7 in Mastering Number. On Thursday we were very lucky to have Crewe Alex come to our classroom and teach us about being healthy. On Friday we were also extremely lucky to have a visit from the Fire Engine, to help us with our Design and Technology project of designing a fire engine vehicle which moves. We also had lots of fun on Friday in the Elf Run for St. Lukes - a huge thank you to everyone who sponsored us!

Amber class: This week, children in Amber Class have been working really hard with their end of term assessments. All children have impressed with how much effort they have put in this week - well done Amber! If this wasn't enough, children also enjoyed their penultimate swimming lesson this week as well as writing recounts in their history lesson and using their knowledge of Stone Age attire to create sketches of what they think the Amesbury Archer could have looked like. We have also started to feel a little festive by decorating our class room with a Christmas theme including making Christmas-inspired 3D shapes in maths!

Emerald class: This week Emerald class have finished their addition and subtraction topic in maths and have begun their multiplication topic. In English, They have expanded sentences with adjectives, prepositions and conjunctions. They have also looked at identifying singular and plural nouns. They completed their zentangle patterns in art, worked on their Victorian partner dance and completed a reflection on the positives and negatives of the invention of the railways in History. They have also continued their computing unit on internet safety.

Ruby class: It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas! This week, we have been transforming Ruby Class into "Mr Blenkiron's Grotto" with paperchain streamers, and colour-refracting snowflakes on our Christmas tree - as well as being treated to Mr B's online advent calendar. To increase the Christmas cheer even further, we have also been completing end of term assessments...

In maths, we have been looking at tables of data and how to interpret them, as well as using our knowledge of subtraction to calculate questions involving 'difference'. Our timestable of the week has been the 6's - we practised this using a counting stick and then made the timestable out of concrete resources for our display.

In English, we have been predicting the end of Hansel & Gretel, and thinking about how the Old Woman's demise is a typical feature of a folk tale - relating this to other folk tales and films where characters have met a similar end.
