Amen.



School

Amethyst Class Amethyst Class have had a great first week together in school. We started our 'Magical Me' topic by reading the stories You Choose and Just Imagine by Nick Sharratt. The children have been talking about and drawing pictures of their families and pets.

We have also been part of Collective Worship with Mr Perry, played circle time games on the school field, had a yoga session in the hall and we then finished the week learning some French words with Madame Spooner.

Sapphire Class Sapphire have had a great first week. The children have settled into their new Year 1 classroom very well. In English the children have been showing off their writing skills whilst writing their own stories of the three little pigs. In maths the children have been using Stem sentences to explain how different objects have been sorted. During their first Happy minds lesson, they have been learning about how our brains work.

Pearl Class The children in Pearl Class had a great start to the new school year as they explored the properties of materials during our Forest School lessons with Mr Hadfield. The children discovered animal homes and what they are made from. They used vocabulary to describe the materials including waterproof, hard, soft, smooth and opaque. After that they built a wooden shelter and created beds with twigs and leaves for their toys. In English, the children have made predictions about what they think will happen to Tabitha Lumpit and Timothy Limpet in the story Troll Swap. In Maths, the children are consolidating their knowledge of place value of numbers to twenty, solving missing number puzzles and learning to spell number names. The children enjoyed representing numbers using concrete



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apparatus. They have also been learning about Growth Mindset and how our brains work. We used straws to blow paint to connect our neurones!

Amber Class Welcome to a new year in Amber Class! This week we have really hit the ground running. On Monday we enjoyed a very active start to the year with our first Forest Schools session and then PE in the afternoon. Then we have been developing our knowledge of place value and multiplication in maths, our writing has seen us start to focus on adjectives and nouns and how to add these together and we have used charades to help us to make predictions about our new class book. We have looked at our core Christian values and discussed the demands of Year 3. We can't wait for next week!

Emerald Class Emerald class have had an outstanding return to school this week. They have looked at the value of each digit in a number in maths and partitioned numbers to 1000. In English, they created noun phrases to describe the picture of Hannah and planned a 5-part story to explain what might have happened to Hannah. The class created some art work inspired by M C Escher. They made their own tessellation which included different types of emotions. We studied a timeline of historical events and the children were able to place the Victorian period on their timelines. We did our first session on My Happy Mind which will help the children learn why regulation strategies are so important. The children met Mr Bateman who is their new PE coach for this term!

Ruby Class The first week is nearly done, and what a great week it has been! The new Rubies (or Newbies) have all settled in tremendously and I believe have already begun to show their increasing maturity!

This week, we have been setting up shop with Ruby Class expectations, designing coat peg labels that represent the children's interests and character, and a few assessments and baselines to get the measure of where the children currently are, especially after six weeks away. The new Year 5's have approached this with an enthusiastic and resilient spirit, but it hasn't all just been tests!

In maths, we have also been focusing on the times-tables that have caused the most grief, begun work on our place value unit and have covered the technical vocabulary involved. Do you know the difference between a number, a numeral and a digit?

In English, we have begun to look at Barack Obama's 'Of Thee I Sing'. At first, making predictions about the text based on the images inside, and later writing a letter to its presidential author to tell him what we thought of it. In History, the children have taken part in a Sticky Knowledge Challenge (telling me everything they can remember about history from across the curriculum since they have been at Audlem). They have completed timelines of important periods in Britain's history - after listening to me rap about it... And have considered the concept of 'bravery' in P4C - ordering images from least to most brave.

Here's to an even better second week!

Diamond Class Year 6 have had a great start to the term. They have started to learn about World War 2 in History and in English, and have so many great stories to tell us from relatives who were in the war. We have also started to learn about place value in maths and have been getting back into our spelling and handwriting. The children have also started their new Wellbeing scheme with 'Happy Mind' and have started to learn about the function of different parts of the brain and how they influence our feelings and behaviour. A busy week, but we have hit the ground running!
