
<u>Big Switch On – last Friday</u>

<u>School</u>

All the children have enjoyed the different work that they have been learning throughout the week and the classrooms have been buzzing with activity. Here is an overview of what has been happening in every class.

Amethyst class: This week in Amethyst Class, we read The Gingerbread Man by Mara Alperin. We made gingerbread men, designed 'Look Out' posters and acted out the story. In maths, we verbally counted together numbers larger than 20 and spotted the pattern of number names beyond the 'teen' numbers. We also enjoyed our art lesson when we went outside to find materials to make our own natural paintbrushes. We then experimented making different marks with paint.

Sapphire class: In Sapphire class we have enjoyed seeing what mischief Nibbles is getting up to in his story. We have been writing lots about what he's been doing and how he's been making the other characters feel. In maths we have been learning about addition and number bonds to 10. We have also enjoyed evaluating our puppets, by thinking what went well and what we would want to improve on.

Pearl class: In Pearl Class, we have collected vocabulary to describe the night sky from Plop's perspective in English. In Maths, we have been learning add and subtract across ten using number lines and tens frames. In History we retold the story of the Fire of London as a reporter. We have also written a letter to the Children's













Commissioner with our ideas of how to improve education. We have been rehearsing for our Christmas performance and perfecting our singing!

Amber class: This week the children in year 3 have been using column addition and subtraction when renaming is not needed. They also started working on column addition where renaming is needed in the ones column. The children practiced using direct speech in English and also using the past and present tenses. The class learnt about how Jewish people welcome babies in RE and designed pneumatic toys for younger children in DT. In art, the children worked with the concept of negative and positive space and identified these in a series of pictures. The class studied Iron Age camps in History and also enjoyed their final swimming session.

Emerald class: This week, Year 4 have enjoyed writing their own fantasy story based on the book 'Gorilla'. They have come up with some wonderful ideas and are busy putting them together. In PE, the class have been learning javelin and have had their last swimming lesson for the year, and in French, have been learning about colours. The class have also been designing some lovely Christmas cards to be sent out to local homes for the elderly.

Ruby class: This week, the children have been working hard in English writing a descriptive paragraph about when Jub first met the old women on the path. They have also used speech to move their writing on. In Maths, we have continued our learning on cube numbers as well as multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. During DT, we have started looking at stuffed toys and how they are constructed, and the children have designed their own stuffed toy. In Science, the children have been looking at the movement of the moon relative to the Earth.

Diamond class: This week in Maths, the Year 6 children RAG-rated a past SAT's reasoning paper and then went through any they found tricky in class. We have also begun to revisit fractions - specifically how to find equivalent fractions and simplify them. In Writing, we used Armin Greder's 'The Island' as a stimulus for diary entries and letters from the perspective of an Islander, complaining about the presence of the foreign man who has washed ashore. We also created charcoal artwork around this text in the form of a comic strip with single words representing the overall feeling of each scene. Diamond Class have worked hard in their rehearsals for our Class Assembly 'War, What is it Good for?', which they performed to the parents on Thursday morning.

Attendance: Whole school weekly attendance this week is 92.56%. This is an improvement on last week but is still well below our school aim of at least 97%. Most of this is due to ill-health, chesty coughs, a vomiting bug and high temperatures. We hope that next week the attendance will improve. In EYFS/KS1, the highest attendance has been in Sapphire class and, in KS2, Emerald class has had the best attendance this week. Congratulations to both classes.
