As a school we are concentrating on the 5 'R's – resilience, reflectiveness, responsibility, resourcefulness and readiness to learn. These are the children who have shown such qualities this week:

School

Amethyst: In Amethyst Class this week, we started reading 'The Pirates are Coming' by John Condon. We went on a treasure hunt following the clues, wrote a list of hidden sea creatures and played a memory game together. In maths, we partitioned the numbers within 7, e.g. seeing that 7 can be made of 5 and 2. We also investigated missing parts and played '7 or not 7?' with 2 different coloured multi-link cubes. We had a great day Thursday celebrating World Book day and loved our Forest School with Mr Hadfield on Friday.

Sapphire: This week in Sapphire class we have been continuing to read our class book "The Curious Case of the Missing Mammoth". We have been focusing on using 'and' to connect words and clauses and adjectives to make our writing more descriptive. In maths, we have been partitioning tens and ones. On Thursday the children loved celebrating World Book Day in their pyjamas and it was so lovely that some of you were able to join us in school.

Pearl: This week in Pearl Class we have been collecting words and phrases to write a description of the setting where dragons live. We continued our work on adding two two-digit numbers as well as counting the number of faces, edges and vertices on 3D shapes. In reading we have explored exciting vocabulary and we have made inferences based on what has been said and done in The Dragonsitter. We thoroughly enjoyed World Book Day and would like to say a special thank you to all the grown-ups who came to read with us on Thursday. We also took part in an exciting BBC Live Lesson for World Book Day where we talked about reading for enjoyment and the children had the opportunity to re-design their favourite book characters. In design and technology, the children learned that an inventor draws plans, makes prototypes and tests their invention to see if it will solve a problem. They learned about the inventions of Leonardo Da Vinci and created a prototype of a parachute which they will test.

Amber: The week in Amber class has absolutely flown by! At the start of the week we were looking at graffiti art and recreating the style of Banksy and enjoyed our first swimming session back after the half term break. In English & reading we have been looking at our new class books (Big Blue Whale & This Morning I Met











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a Whale) and in Maths we have continued our learning about length & perimeter. We have been laying down some disco beats in our recorder session this week learning an accompaniment to 'Le Freak' by Chic and we have started our new science topic looking at plants.

Emerald: This week, Emerald Class have worked on dividing 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers with remainders. We have practised this skill using cubes and part whole models. In English, the children have planned and written letters of advice to Livia and Tranio using the present perfect tense. The children finished painting their Roman shields in DT and wrote a recount of our trip to the DEVA Roman experience in History. We started our new Science topic of animals including humans and the class planned and executed a science experiment to investigate tooth decay. In RE, the children looked at the significance of Palm Sunday and The Last Supper for Christians. On Thursday, we enjoyed having an inspirational World Book Day!

Ruby: This week in Ruby Class, the children have been continuing to secure their knowledge of long multiplication by multiplying 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers and applying this to worded problems. In English, the children have been working on parenthesis (using brackets, dashes or commas to add extra information into a sentence) and have observed this in their new Guided Reading text 'Exploring Space'. In Computing, the children have learned about how search engines generate their results using an index created by web-crawlers. We created our own index showing where various items could be found around the school and then made PowerPoints demonstrating how we can reduce the amount of search results by refining our search terms. On Tuesday, the children had an art-based day and painted/drew pieces which reflected how they can let their light shine in school and in the local community. On Thursday, the children will be enjoying World Book Day in their pyjamas. They will be decorating potatoes to represent their favourite book characters, will be listening to several famous story-tellers online and will have a chance to read themselves and have a bedtime story read to them.

Diamond: This week, Year 6 have been learning about The Amazon Rainforest and river. They have also been reading more of Oscar Wilde's story, 'The Selfish Giant' and have been writing their own personification descriptions. On World Book Day, they listened to stories read by Nothando Zulu who is the president of the Black Storytellers Alliance in America, and took part in some World Book Day reading activities. Some parents were able to join us in reading bedtime stories to their child, and Year 6 had fun making the classroom ready for bedtime stories with Mrs Bird.
