The 5 'R's

School

Amethyst: This week in Amethyst Class, we have been continuing to read 'The Pirates are Coming' by John Condon. We wrote a list of treasure that we found, labelled treasure maps and made a 'Wanted' poster. In maths, we explored the composition of numbers within 10, focusing on when 2 equal parts combine to make a whole. We looked at doubling and seeing 'the same number twice', or '2 times the number'. We recorded it symbolically, e.g. $3 + 3 = 2 \times 3$, and used the language '2 groups of 3'. We also had fun on our treasure hunt around the school grounds, searching for the hidden chocolate treasure that had been buried.

Sapphire: This week in Sapphire class in English we finished our class story "The Case of the Missing Mammoth" We have been writing our own versions of the story by changing the setting and one of the characters. In maths, we have been focusing on one more and one less. In science we have started our investigation 'are all leaves the same?' The children learnt that we needed to write a prediction prior to starting our investigation. Next week we will carry out the experiment to find out if the children's predications were correct. On Thursday the children really enjoyed their visit to Crewe Lyceum to watch 'Zog' by Julia Donaldson.

Pearl: This week Year 2 have continued reading 'The Dragonsitter'. We have been learning to 'read and explain' by finding words or phrases in a text to back up our answers to questions. In Maths we have been practising adding two 2-digit numbers as well as revising our shape knowledge. In Science we have used a resource from Sir David Attenborough to think about different habitats animals can live in and how they are suited to their environment. We have begun to discuss the Easter story and we have been practising for the Easter celebration in church. The children thoroughly enjoyed visiting Crewe Lyceum theatre to watch 'Zog' by Julia Donaldson as part of our World Book Day celebrations. In History, we researched famous inventors and inventions focusing particularly on animation. We sorted 2D and 3D shapes in different ways developing reasoning skills using stem sentences.

Amber: This week in Amber Class, we have been looking at religious art and traditional Christian representations of Jesus and the resurrection. We have discussed the Easter story and looked at how this is represented in many ways through art. In music we continued our recorder sessions and in swimming a number of children have been assessed against the National Curriculum objectives. In our English sessions we have been writing a recount from the perspective of the protagonist of our class book and in Maths we have been solving problems relating to the comparison of metres, centimetres and millimetres. We've also continued to compare the Amazon and Sherwood forests and looked at the lifecycles of flowering plants.











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Emerald: This week, Emerald class have divided 3-digit numbers by 1 digit numbers including with remainders! In English, they wrote letters of advice to Livia and Tranio and edited and proofread their work. They also gathered ideas for speech sandwiches they will be writing next week. The children finished off their science investigation about the effects of sugary drinks on teeth and had a singfest rehearsal. On Wednesday and Thursday, the class travelled to Delamere forest for their residential trip. In Delamere, they built dens, hunted for badgers, went orienteering, had a campfire and explored the forest.

Ruby: This week, in Ruby Class, the children have been consolidating their knowledge of long multiplication and have begun to work on division (using various approaches including the "bus-stop method"). In English, the children have been introduced through clues to their new text 'The Darkest Dark'. We have begun to write descriptive openers including many of the literary devices we have learned about so far in Year 5, and, in Writing Conference, we have been focusing on using semicolons to join independent clauses that are related in some way - e.g. "The dinosaur roared; an asteroid was heading straight for it." or "I missed the bus; I guess I'm walking to school." In PSHE, the children have heard some great advice about how to be a good friend. They then wrote letters to their future selves about the advice that most spoke to them personally. In History, the class have been researching the Anglo-Saxon gods that our days of the week are named after, and compared these to the Roman gods that the French days of the week are named after. They then had a brief lesson in democracy and have started to write manifestos for their chosen god who wants to become the new king of the gods in place of Woden.

Diamond: This week, Year 6 have been doing their DT research by looking at how fairground rides are constructed and how they move. In RE, they have also been thinking about Holy Week and the concept of resurrection. They have then had some thoughtful discussions about what Christians believe happens after you die and reflected on their own beliefs. In PE, the children have been playing some hockey matches.

Prayers to Share this week – We pray for everyone at home, school, local community and the wider world at these uncertain times to be safe and well.
