<u>School</u>

Amethyst Class: This week in Amethyst Class, we finished the story 'Supertato,' wrote lists of what we could see happening in the pictures and labelled his appearance. We also made a wanted poster for the Evil Pea. In maths, we looked at odd and even and put objects into pairs. We read the story 'One Odd Day' by Dani Sneed and made our own odd day picture. We played a barrier game, building models with blocks. In pairs, one partner gave the instructions and checked if their partner could arrange the blocks in the same way. We also had great fun during Healthy Week, playing rugby and rounders.

Sapphire Class: We have had a very active in Sapphire Class for Healthy Week. The children loved taking part in Sports Day on Thursday. In English, we have been reading our new class story 'Goldilocks and the one bear.' We have been making predictions about the story. In science, we have started our new topic plants! We have planted our own sunflower seeds and thought about what they need to grow and survive.

Pearl Class: This week, Year 2 have been continuing to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes. We talked about stories we know containing wolves and wrote rules for walking through the woods, focussing on the use of contractions. We have continued reading Fantastic Mr Fox and looked at words from the story with suffixes. We have practiced for Sports Day and thoroughly enjoyed taking part in all the races on Thursday. During Healthy Week we have learnt about the importance of a balanced diet, hygiene and exercise and we continued working on 'My Happy Minds'. We looked in supermarket magazines for healthy foods and used these to design our own healthy smoothies.

Amber Class: The class have had a very sporty week, participating in dodgeball, athletics and a mixed game of cricket and rounders. We have also played all kinds of throwing and catching games. Using the film "Up" as our starting point, we have been learning about adventures. We have also continued with our study of fractions and are hoping to move to a new topic in maths next week.

Emerald Class: This week in Emerald class, we have worked with decimals and have ordered them and investigated the place value of each digit. In English, the children have written first person recounts of the story 'When the Giant Stirred' including fronted adverbials, adjectives and conjunctions in their work. The children enjoyed experimenting with materials in art and developing their drawings and compositions. We











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looked at describing the weather in French and the children explored how to relate to each other in our wellbeing session. Of course, everybody enjoyed a wonderful Sports Day on Thursday.

Ruby Class: This week in Ruby Class, the children have been focusing on calculating angles around a point and adjacent angles on a straight line. In English, inspired by the front cover of The Hunter, we have been slow-writing stories about a girl and her elephant - including beautiful description, dialogue and cohesion. As part of Healthy Week, we have enjoyed a martial arts session, utilising the children's knowledge of Jiu-jitsu, Karate and Taekwondo, as well as Mr Blenkiron's knowledge of Judo. The class also revised and learned about eating and drinking healthily, making posters about the standout messages from the session. The children all performed fantastically on Sports Day and did themselves proud - congratulations again to Team Oak, who won overall!

Diamond Class: In Year 6, the children have been enjoying extra PE lessons which have a PSHE link to them. We have been looking at how to challenge barriers which might prevent people from taking part in exercise. Our first challenge was to get moving by putting together a dance. We then learned some games which made us think about those who may have physical difficulties with moving, and learned how to adapt the games to make them accessible. The class have also been finishing their lovely stories called 'Rabuto', and have been practising their leavers' show. In RE, we have been thinking about how Humanists live their lives compared to those who have religious beliefs.

Attendance this week

This week, the best attendance in KS1 and Early Years was in Sapphire who have had almost full attendance. In KS2, Amber have had the best attendance. Congratulations to both year groups. This week the average attendance has been 95.71% which is a little higher than last week. There have not been as many unauthorised holidays this week which has helped the overall attendance but we are still just short of our target of 96% or above.
