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#### School

Amethyst class: In Amethyst Class this week, we finished reading The Three Little Pigs by Mara Alperin. We found the missing pigs and used positional language, played bingo with the red 'tricky' words and made a plan to trap the wolf. In maths, we explored composition by focusing on the concept of 'wholes' and 'parts' and investigated human bodies/animal bodies and familiar toys. On Monday, we also had fun watching the judging of the Great Audlem Bake off competition.

**Sapphire class:** This week in Sapphire class we have been busy continuing with our versions of the story Lost and Found. We are very excited to read each other's finished stories at the end of the week. In maths, we are looking at fact families and how to use part/whole models to complete subtraction sentences. In science we have used the rainy weather to help us answer the question "how big is a raindrop?". We have also practised our Christmas performance and learned what our parts are. We are so excited to show you.

**Pearl class:** We started off the week with some beautiful baking for The Great Audlem Bake Off - well done to everyone in Pearl Class who took part. We have continued to read The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark and we have experimented with language, making our own verses of a poem. In D&T we have designed our own moving Christmas cards using either a slider or lever mechanism. In Geography, we have identified the four countries of the United Kingdom and we have named to capital cities. In Maths, we are developing our understanding of addition and recalling number facts quickly. We have also been busy practising for our Christmas performance - we can't wait to show you!

Amber class: This week, Amber Class have been busy after their weekend of baking! We have managed to merge a PE lesson with the Football World Cup, had a bonus Forest Schools session and continued with our History by looking at chronology. In English we have looked at verbs and synonyms and in maths we have started to consider how we can use the column method to subtract. We have also had a very interesting discussion about how to solve the problem of homelessness in our Philosophy for Children session.

**Emerald class:** This week, Emerald Class have explored subordinating conjunctions and how they can be used to add extra detail to their sentences. They described the inside of the circus tent using adjectives and added extra detail using subordinating conjunctions. In maths, the children used inverse operations to check their calculations and practised estimating their answers using rounding skills. The children investigated conductivity using an energy ball in Science and made paper doves to symbolise The Holy Spirit in RE. We finished off some work on primary and secondary sources in History and talked about boundaries and asking for permission in PSHE. The class loved participating in the first ever Audlem Bake Off!

**Ruby class:** This week Ruby Class have been focusing on factors and Prime numbers in maths. They have learned a rap about prime numbers, and have used their knowledge to create beautiful patterns. In English, we have been looking at figurative language, specifically personification, and the children have been writing sentences describing inanimate objects as if they are alive/have minds. In Science, the children have been exploring time zones around the world by researching different cities across the globe. In RE, we have been looking at the biblical description of angels and comparing these to traditional artistic depictions and our own preconceived ideas. The children then had a go at drawing an archangel based on a description in the book of Daniel.

**Diamond class:** Year 6 have had a very busy week preparing for their class assembly. They have been learning lines from Macbeth to perform to their families, as well as sharing their artwork and all their learning from this term. They have also had their first 'Buddy Reading' session with Reception Class which all children thoroughly

enjoyed. The children have also been building shelters in Forest Schools and learning how to keep themselves dry and warm. In RE, the class have been learning more about Hinduism and the four main aims of a Hindu's life.
